## **Giving to Education Nears \$11 Million**

Based on a sample of Maine's Top 20 Grantmakers, grant awards for Education in 2009 totaled \$10.9 million. These funders made 775 grants in the Education focus area.


Education grants are any grant award made to nonprofits that are educational institutions. These include pre-schools, elementary and secondary schools, college and universities, libraries, and literacy programs.

#### **Education is 2nd Largest Grant Focus**

Among the 8 major grant areas, Education received the second largest share of dollars from Maine's Top 20 Grantmakers (21%), second only to Human Services (29%).

The 21% to Education represented a drop from the 24% awarded in 2008, but was in-line with prior years. In 2009, funders appeared to respond to the economic crisis by giving more to Human Services and less to other categories.

## **Giving by Type of Foundation**

**Private foundations gave over 77% of the \$10.9 million to Education in 2009.** The Maine Community Foundation contributed 19%, and corporate funders gave almost 4% of the total giving in this category.
